Dear Friends,

Last year presented everyone, including Homes for the Brave, with significant challenges. In spite of all the obstacles, we made adjustments to overcome them and produced outstanding outcomes for our Veterans.

The Covid-19 pandemic impacted our entire 2021 fiscal year. We never had the option of closing our doors to regroup or re-energize. Simultaneously, a renewed struggle for racial justice unfolded nationally. We engaged in a process of ongoing learning and humility to advance racial equity for the individuals we serve, our staff, and our community.

Even in a job market that was significantly affected by Covid-19, our Vocational Program again excelled. A full 82% of Veterans in the program obtained jobs, enabling them to save money and move closer to independence.

Under the leadership of Chief Clinical Officer, Dr. Stephanie Lynam and Clinical Director, Sarah McDonald, our clinical team rose above numerous challenges. Case managers found ways to provide services despite the growing demand for mental health treatment due to anxiety, isolation, and stress caused by the pandemic. Many mental health resources in the community were only available via telehealth, which is not a good fit for many of our residents. We modified our approaches to include both in-person and telehealth appointments to best meet the needs of our Veterans in overcoming addiction, PTSD and other mental health concerns.

We were thrilled to reopen our Homes for the Brave Veterans Service Center on June 1, 2021. All interested Veterans, including those currently in our residential programs, alumni, and others, can be enriched by our computer classes, job prep workshops, life skills seminars, and other HFTB Veterans Service Center programming.

We will mark the tenth anniversary of the opening of our PFC Nicholas A. Madaras Home for Female Veterans. We are proud to be the first and still the only program in Connecticut exclusively for female Veterans experiencing homelessness and their young children.

We look to the future and will continue to consider the changing demographics of the Veterans that we serve. We are working on the installation of an elevator in our 114-year-old headquarters and men's transitional residence on Park Avenue in Bridgeport and an expansion of the building to improve conditions for the men we serve. We are so proud of the resilience of our residents and the dedication of our staff. We are grateful for our remarkable Board of Directors and by our loyal donors' support.

We hope you enjoy this Community Report. Please continue to walk with us so Veterans who answered the call are housed, fed, clothed, employed, and supported.

OUR PROGRAMS

HOMES FOR THE BRAVE

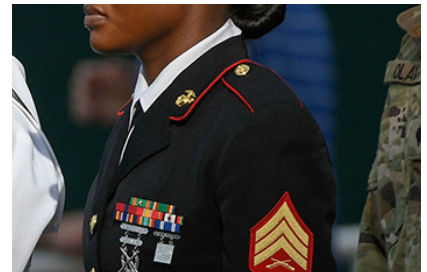
Homes for the Brave (HFTB) provides 42 beds of transitional living for Veterans and non-veteran men experiencing homelessness, with 37 spaces designated for Veterans. It is the largest program of its kind in Connecticut.



Armando, who served in both the Air Force and the Army National Guard, found himself living out of his car. Winter was approaching when he came to Homes for the Brave. "I was relieved to have a warm place to stay," said Armando. "HFTB saved me and allowed me to get my life together," he said. Armando utilized all of the services that HFTB offers its residents, which allowed him to train for and secure a job, find housing, and move forward in a positive direction. "I am very grateful to HFTB for offering me the opportunity to change my life."

FEMALE SOLDIERS: FORGOTTEN HEROES

The PFC Nicholas A. Madaras Home provides transitional housing for up to 14 female Veterans experiencing homelessness and their young children. It is Connecticut's first and only program of its kind exclusively for female Veterans.



For over a decade at the PFC Nicholas A. Madaras Home, we have been serving female Veterans who are three times more likely to be homeless than their civilian counterparts.

After five years of service in the Navy, Rebecca came home and found herself in an extremely toxic environment. She knew she had to get her young son and herself another place to stay, but she had no options. She was quickly referred to Female Soldiers: Forgotten Heroes and, upon moving in, found it to be a great environment. "I was so happy to find myself and my son in such a stable environment," Rebecca said. Rebecca utilized the clinical opportunities FS:FH offers, and her life completely turned around. "FS:FH instilled confidence in me. I learned coping skills, life skills, and I felt safe," she said, "It gave me a second chance at a successful life."

Waldorf House provides permanent supportive housing with case management services for 9 Veterans and non-Veterans who are formerly homeless and who are now independent. Waldorf House residents work with their case managers to reach their personal goals.

*Since opening, we have served 1,436 individuals,
149 female Veterans, and 17 children.*

We expect there to be a significant increase in Veteran homelessness due to the devastating impact of the COVID-19 global pandemic. As we prepare to respond to this, we are so grateful for your continued support.

TRAINING FOR SUCCESS VOCATIONAL & EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

Our Training for Success Vocational & Educational Program offers employment services. Staff work one-on-one with clients on resume writing, job searches, and interview preparation. We connect Veterans with available educational benefits and help provide funding for job training.

"[HFTB] carries a lot of weight in the community." Marine Corps Veteran Thomas worked closely with our Vocational Specialist the five months he was at HFTB. Using the resources available to him in the program, he was hired at Goodwill, a job he still holds two years later! During the pandemic, he embraced his entrepreneur mindset and started his own business sanitizing homes and businesses. "If it wasn't for HFTB, I don't know what I would be doing."



TRAINING FOR SUCCESS



Vocational & Educational Program

TONY CINQUANTA VETERANS SERVICE CENTER



The **Tony Cinquanta Veterans Service Center** provides immediate basic needs and referrals to community services for any Veteran who is homeless or in a housing crisis. In-house offerings include life skills training, computer classes, opportunities to interface with representatives from federal legislative offices, art therapy, and walking groups. The Service Center also provides intensive follow-up case management services to Veterans recently discharged from housing programs and those at risk of becoming homeless.

CLINICAL PROGRAM

Many of the Veterans we serve are ineligible for VA clinical services. Some find it difficult to travel to the medical campuses in West Haven or Newington. We launched the **Homes**

for the Brave Clinical Program to address the gaps in services for Veterans with mental health and substance use disorders. During this last year, this program has allowed us to provide critical support for Veterans who have struggled during the pandemic.
