It's an exciting time to be part of Homes for the Brave!

We are proud to announce our Park Avenue headquarters renovation is already making a difference in the lives of the Veterans we serve. By increasing accessibility and privacy and offering enrichment spaces, their new home is shaping their journey to successful futures.

Our programming has expanded too. Our clinical services include trauma informed psychotherapy sessions and we have partnered with the University of Bridgeport Nursing School and the West Haven VA's Mobil Medical Unit to enhance the health and wellness of the Veterans in our facilities and the Greater Bridgeport area. Our Team at the Tony Cinquanta Veterans Service Center has been working to assist more Veterans with housing, veterans disability claims, and community support programming.

To aid our clients' independence, we grew our workshop offerings. Clients participate in training on a variety of new topics including budgeting, fraud prevention, savings, self-care, gratitude and attitude enhancement, finding budget-friendly utility programs, nutrition and voting.

Our Vocational Team assisted 85% of participating Veterans to acquire employment opportunities or complete job training programs.

We are grateful for the guidance of our Board of Directors, the dedication of our outstanding Staff, and for the determination and efforts of our Veterans as they pursue independence and permanent housing solutions.

Our heartfelt thanks for your generous support cannot be understated, especially in these challenging times, and, as you will see in the pages of this report, we are truly creating brighter futures together.

Homes for the Brave

Homes for the Brave (HFTB), established in 2002, offers 42 beds of transitional housing for men experiencing homelessness, with 37 of those spaces reserved specifically for Veterans. The facility includes 11 private suites and is Connecticut's largest program dedicated to supporting Veterans in their journey to stability and independence.



Madaras House (Female Soldiers: Forgotten Heroes)

The PFC Nicholas A. Madaras Home, which opened in 2011, provides transitional housing for up to 14 Veteran women experiencing homelessness and their young children. It is Connecticut's first and only program exclusively for this population.

Waldorf House

Waldorf House provides permanent supportive housing with case management services for nine Veterans and non-Veterans who were formerly homeless. Residents pay 27% of their gross income for rent, including utilities.

The Tony Cinquanta Veterans Service Center at HFTB opened in 2010. It caters to Veterans experiencing housing instability or those who are at risk of becoming homeless. Individuals can seek help with immediate basic needs. Staff also makes referrals to housing and other supportive services. Services include case management, assistance with benefits applications, food assistance, connections to federal congressional staffers, referrals for housing and supportive services, and community groups.

Training for Success Vocational & Educational Program



The Training for Success Vocational & Educational Program offers employment services. Staff work one-on-one with clients on resume writing, job searches, and interview preparation. They connect Veterans with available educational benefits and help provide funding for job training. HFTB's vocational program also offers job prep workshops and computer skills classes to all Veterans.



Clinical Program

The Homes for the Brave Clinical Program addresses the gap in services for mental health and substance treatment needs of Veterans and their family members in our area. Clinical programming includes access to recoveryoriented therapy and wellness programming offering telehealth and in-person sessions with licensed clinicians.



Scaling For Success

Homes for the Brave made history this year with the opening of a new state-of-the-art wing at our Park Avenue headquarters. The building expansion marks a milestone in our 22-year history and allows us to improve the lives of the Veterans we serve.

With the addition of eleven individual suites and an elevator, the \$3.5M project provides much-needed privacy for residents and accessibility to our services. Additionally, fitness, game, music, and reflection rooms nurture health and growth.

We thank the US Department of Veterans Affairs and the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, as well as the CT Department of Economic and Community Development for helping to make this expansion possible.



SHOWCASING SUCCESS: DEBBIE (U.S. AIR FORCE)

Debbie, an Air Force Veteran, served for 12 years, earning a degree in Business Management and fulfilling her dream of traveling. After facing eviction from her home of 20 years, she turned to Homes for the Brave. HFTB provided her shelter at the Madaras House for Women Veterans and later helped her secure permanent housing. "It was a big relief—it helped me regain my independence," she says. Now, she encourages other Veterans to reach out, adding, "Homes for the Brave is a great resource, connecting Veterans—especially women—to lifechanging services."
