




DEGREES OF SUCCESS: JOSE (U.S. ARMY VETERAN)

After losing his business during the COVID-19 pandemic, U.S. Army Veteran Jose became homeless. That's when he found Homes for the Brave, a place where he received the housing and support needed to rebuild his life. "My case managers kept me from becoming complacent," he said. "They gave me a plan. They set goals for me, and I was able to reach those goals." With guidance from HFTB's Vocational Program, Jose went back to school and earned an Associate's degree in Human Services. "I went from being homeless to graduating college," he shared. "Homes for the Brave is a place you can go for the help that you need. Don't try it out on your own. There's a resource available, and it works - it worked for me."

As we reflect on the last year at Homes for the Brave, we recognize a year defined by meaningful achievements.

Our Headquarters Building Project, which began prior to 2020, has culminated in a remarkable facility—unlike any other in Connecticut or the surrounding region—for Veterans transitioning from homelessness. The newly renovated Homes for the Brave now features 11 private suites, a beautiful second-floor library, and a lower-level wellness space complete with fitness, music, reflection, and TV/game rooms. The outside grounds have been transformed into a welcoming plaza, lined with commemorative bricks and benches.

Thanks to your support, we've been able to stand by our Veterans as they face life's challenges head-on. It has been an extraordinary year for both our Clinical and Vocational Programs. Our Clinical team provided essential care and guidance to Veterans and their family members, helping them heal and rebuild. Meanwhile, our Vocational Program empowered 78% of participating Veterans to take meaningful steps toward independence through job placements, training programs, and college enrollment.

Even amid the disruptions of construction, our dedicated staff remained unwavering in their commitment to guiding Veterans along the path to independence. Simultaneously, our exceptional Board of Directors provided strong leadership—offering insight, dedication, and vision that helped steer us through the year.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to each of you for your steadfast commitment to our Veterans and their futures. Your support makes a lasting impact, and we invite you to continue standing with us as we help those who served reach their fullest potential.


VALUES:

Homes for the Brave

Connecticut's largest program supporting Veterans in their journey to stability and independence, providing 42 beds of transitional housing for men experiencing homelessness, with 37 spaces reserved for Veterans, including 11 private suites.

Madaras House for Women Veterans

Connecticut's first and only program exclusively for Veteran women experiencing homelessness and their young children, with transitional housing for up to 14 families.

Waldorf House

Permanent supportive housing with case management services for nine formerly homeless Veterans and non-Veterans. Residents pay 27% of their gross income for rent and utilities.



Tony Cinquanta Veterans Service Center


Helping Veterans experiencing housing instability or those at risk of becoming homeless.

Providing immediate basic needs assistance, case management, help with benefit applications, food assistance, referrals for housing and supportive services, and more.



Training for Success Vocational & Educational Program

Providing employment services such as resume writing, job search assistance, computer skills classes, interview and job preparation workshops, and connections to educational benefits and job training funding.



Clinical Program

Addressing the gap in services for mental health and substance treatment needs of Veterans and their families, including access to recovery-oriented therapy and wellness programming with licensed clinicians.



REBUILDING LIVES: ELIZABETH (U.S. ARMY VETERAN)

Elizabeth, a U.S. Army Veteran, came to Homes for the Brave's Madaras House for Women Veterans after suddenly becoming homeless. Alone and afraid, she spent several days not knowing where to turn—until she was given the number for Homes for the Brave.

"I was so scared and didn't know where to go," she said. "Then I was welcomed into Madaras House and immediately felt at home." With support from the programs and services offered, Elizabeth regained her stability. "Homes for the Brave helped get me housed and back on my feet. It was a truly positive experience that helped me rebuild my life," she said.
